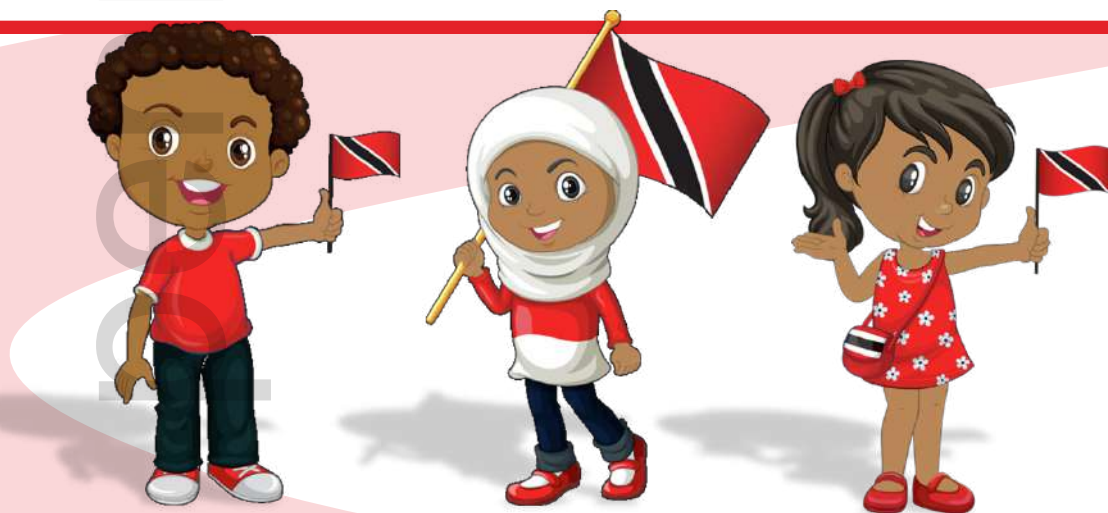
Citizenship

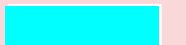

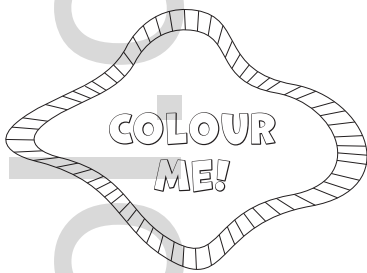

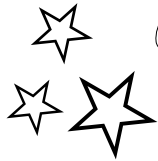

It features birds native to Trinidad and Tobago; the Scarlet Ibis, the Hummingbird and the Cocrico. The three ships represent the Trinity as well as the three ships of Columbus. The three mountain peaks represent the Southern Mountain Range, called the "Three Sisters". The fruited coconut palm dates are an ode to the days when we were a separate administrative unit.

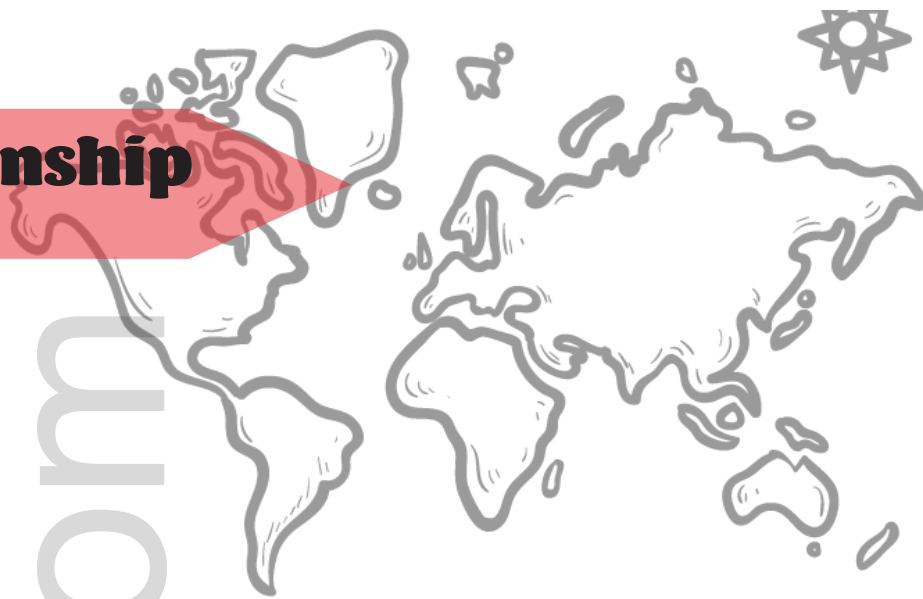
